FLYERS/POSTERS

***Have these ready to go**

***Have at least 200 copies printed on bright coloured paper**

***Let the community & police know you will take the flyers down when your dog is found**

CHECK LIST

- Charge your cell phone and have necessary contact numbers on your person. Make sure your message provides instructions on what information to leave and another number to call if possible in the event that you miss the call.
- Go through your contact and flyer check lists
- Ask the post office if they will post the information and communicate to the mail carriers
- Print a map of your town and make copies for your volunteers to know where to look or to post flyer
- Ask the local school(s) to make an announcement.
- Put a news story in the paper
- Set up a crate with some food in it on your front step, he may come home & go into it for security.

What to bring when searching

- Bring a leash attached to a martingale collar
 - Bring smelly treats like sardines
 - Bring a metal food bowl with kibble to attract him to the sound
 - Bring water
 - Bring charged cell phone
 - Bring a spotlight or a large flashlight & extra batteries
 - Bring a map to indicate what areas have been covered
 - Bring flyers to hand out to people in the area who have not heard
 - Place a lost dog flyer to the back of your vehicle
 - When posting flyers, bring a staple gun and extra staples. Be sure to staple all four corners of flyer. Only staple to Telephone poles (not trees). If bad weather is forecast, place flyers in sheet protectors prior to posting.
 - Bring a paper and pen for phone numbers
 - Bring first aid kit
 - Bring a loud squeaker
 - Field glasses
 - Be prepared for the weather, bring a change of socks and shoes
